LEHIGHTON DOWNTOWN PARTNERSHIP

In July 2021, Lehighton Borough Council had approved contributing \$10,000 towards the new Main Street Manager Pilot Program with the Carbon Chamber and Economic Development Corp. Also, Lehighton Downtown Initiative has allocated their funds towards the new program.

The Lehighton Main Street Steering Committee and Lehighton Downtown Initiative will merge together under the umbrella of CCEDC as the new "Lehighton Downtown Partnership." The group will be able to combine efforts for overall improvements to the downtown and local economic development. There will be a focus on the Main Street Four Point Approach along with resources available through the Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber for this program. Once successful, the CCEDC will offer this program to surrounding Carbon County communities.

In August, the CCEDC had announced the hire of Bambi Elsasser who will be working as the Lehighton Main Street Manager. Bambi is no stranger to Lehighton as she has been an active volunteer for the Downtown Farmers Market, Wine on the River, Rocktoberfest and other downtown projects. Bambi will be a familiar and friendly face in our downtown.

The merger of the organizations is underway. Stay tuned for additional information as this transition is underway.



STORMWATER MANAGEMENT: STORM DRAINS

The steel grate that covers a storm water inlet along the edge of your street is often thought of as the final destination for runoff from rain or snow melt. During a flood this inlet is critical to providing a flow path for stormwater away from your property. It's the beginning of a system of pipes and ditches that eventually lead to lakes, streams, rivers, wetlands and coastal waters.

Lehighton Borough is preventing stormwater pollution through a stormwater management program. This program addresses stormwater pollution resulting from construction, illegal dumping to the stormsewer system, and pollution prevention and good housekeeping procedures in the Borough's operations. Under the program the Borough is required to educate its residents about practices that cause clean stormwater to become polluted stormwater. By learning and practicing the following guidelines you will keep your property and our community free from the impacts of storm water pollution. In addition these benefits flow downstream to many other individuals.



GOOD STORM WATER PRACTICES

- Collect used engine fluids and recycle
- Repair drip leaks from vehicles as soon as they are discovered. These leaks are typically onto paved areas and water runoff will carry them to storm systems.
- Never dump used cleaning and household products or engine fluids on the ground surface.
- Follow the manufacturer's instructions for disposal of cleaning and household products.
- Use garden and lawn care products like fertilizers and pesticides in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Note that the impact of a large dose may be lowered by a significant storm runoff event that occurs after the application.
- Clean up pet waste and dispose of it so that it's not introduced into the storm sewer collection system.
- Avoid long term exposure of bare soil when completing projects that require earth disturbance. Soil sediment within waterways can have negative impacts on fish and shellfish populations.
- Establish a vegetative cover by seeding as soon as a project is complete.

PREPARE YOUR HOME FOR WINTER



As winter approaches, our thoughts turn to other activities as we plan for the annual hibernation to the indoors. This is also a good time to plan a safe hibernation for your house as well. The constant change in the weather can have a significant effect on your house that, if left unchecked, may result in major repairs in the future.

Now is the time to inspect your house for anything that does not appear to be normal. Things to look for include loose siding, missing or torn shingles, broken or sticking doors, missing caulking around windows or any other item that will leave your home exposed to the elements. Now is the time to start addressing these items before the cold weather sets in and these items are forgotten.

You may also want to take a look at other items that are often overlooked until it is too late. One important item is your home heating system. Most people who are not on a maintenance program forget to have service performed until well into the heating season when the furnace decides to stop working. Unfortunately, this is the time that most heating contractors are busiest and you may have to wait for service. Avoid the headache and plan ahead.

Items such as your water heater may need your attention as well as other home appliances. Remember to check and make sure water pipes are properly insulated and not exposed to freezing temperatures. Be sure that leaves and debris do not obstruct water flow from gutters and downspouts. Water that freezes and is allowed to back up rooftops often provides you with unwelcome leaks. The lists are endless, but remember your home is a major investment - take good care of it.

Who Needs Building Codes?

We all do – whether in our homes, offices, schools, stores, factories or places of entertainment. **We rely on the safety of structures that surround us in our everyday life.** The public need for protection from disaster due to fire, structural collapse and general deterioration underscores the need for modern codes and their administration. Most aspects of building construction (electrical wiring, heating, sanitary facilities) can represent a potential hazard to building occupants and users. **Building codes provide safeguards.** Although no code can eliminate all risks, reducing risks to an acceptable level helps.

Who is Leighton Borough's Codes Enforcer?

Barry Isett and Associates, Inc. is the appointed Building Code Official, Zoning and Code Enforcement Officer for Leighton Borough, appointed in 2013. As certified Inspectors, our responsibility is the protection of the health, safety and welfare of the public by creating safe buildings and communities. This is accomplished through the enforcement of federal, state and local ordinances adopted by the Borough.

We take pride in providing a professional level of assistance to the community. Enforcement often begins with a written letter (Notice of Violation) to identify items that are out of compliance, the code requirement, a timeframe for completion and a fine if no action is taken to abate the issues. These items are required to be listed in the notice and may seem overwhelming and are often interpreted as demanding and offering no help. In fact, that is not the case. The Borough wants compliance with codes to ensure health and safety for the community. Isett will work with you throughout the process and provide guidance. Cooperation on your part is needed in order to achieve a successful completion of the project.

Property Maintenance and Quality of Life

One of the Borough's highest priorities is to work with property owners and tenants to preserve and maintain the neighborhoods and commercial areas. The presence of property nuisances detracts from the enjoyment and quality of life in the community. Isett handles complaints related to private property nuisances, both residential and commercial. You can assist Code Enforcement by reporting any condition you believe to be a nuisance.

Together, we can keep Leighton Borough a beautiful place in which to live and do business.
